Story

Château Carignan is located in the town of Carignan de Bordeaux, 10km (6.5 miles) East of Bordeaux. The castle was built in 1452, by Jean Poton de Xaintrailles - comrade in arms of Joan of Arc - and was instrumental in the victory of the Castillon battle that ended the Hundred Years' War.

In 2007, Andy Lench purchased the estate that now covers 150 hectares (370 acres) of which 65 hectares (160 acres) are under vine and are spread over Cadillac Côtes de Bordeaux.

Farming philosophy : sustainable

« L'Orangerie » refers to the orangery that is part of the Château.

Grape varieties : 50% Merlot, 50% Cabernet Sauvignon

Plot size: 5 ha (12 acres)

Average age of the vines : 10-15 years

South-Southwest facing

Elevation : 50m (164ft)

Soils : Clay, limestone covered with stony gravels

FARMING PRACTICES

- Training Method: Guyot double
- No herbicide
- Cover crops every 2 rows
- Use Organic fertilizer including manure sourced from cows at the estate

Winemaking

- Nocturnal mechanical harvest/ Destemmed (100%)
- Direct pressing
- Fermentation : Temperature-controlled stainless-steel tank / 20 days at 64°F
- No malolactic fermentation
- Aging : 4-5 months in stainless-steel tanks / on fine lees
- Fined : Yes
- Filtration : Tangential
- SO2 Total: <100PPM Vegan : Yes

Tasting notes

A delicate arrangement of floral notes on the nose are met with a vibrant freshness of red fruit on the palate, creating a harmonious union in the glass.
