

Story

Located in Alsace near Colmar, the estate was founded in 1941 by Aloyse Meyer and has a long story of family hand-over for 5 generations. The estate is now led by Isabelle and her sister Céline. The name « Josmeyer » came from Hubert (the 3rd generation) who chose to combine his ancestor first name Joseph and the family name because Meyer was very common in the area.

The domain comprises 28ha of vines, settled on 5 different terroirs, and benefits from an exceptional micro-climate. Since 2004, the entire vineyard is cultivated according to organic and biodynamic principles.

Alsace Dream is a nod to the regional emblem, the stork, as seen by the mischievous eye of the artist Raymond Waydelich.

Grape varieties

Blend of 1/3 Gewurztraminer, 1/3 Muscat and 1/3 Pinot (Auxerrois and Blanc).

Terroir

Average age of the vines : 40 years

The grapes come from Herrenweg de Turckheim plots. Situated on the alluvial fan of the Fecht river, this terroir is characterised by colluvial deposits of gravel-sand substrate, alluvium, and stones. Similar to the soil of Graves, this terroir produces aromatic, mature, and elegant wines.

Winemaking

Pet' Nat = ancestral method

Fermentation starts in stainless steel tank. During the fermentation, the wine is transferred into the bottle. The resulting carbon dioxide is trapped, creating the bubbles.

No added sulfites

No filtration

Tasting notes

Aromas of citrus, apple, pear and biscuits.

Soft bubbles on a round and creamy palate. Good freshness with a subtle note of yeast on the palate.

Pairing suggestions

To drink as an aperitif, with charcuterie or light fish
